c) The applicant will be required to hold a Proposition 218 election prior to completion of

formation.

d) The removal of Rosedale-Rio Bravo Water Storage District owned parcels from inclusion

in district boundaries.

e) The applicant will revise the district boundary map and legal description before a

Certificate of Completion will be recorded.

f) The Board of Directors of the District is to be composed of five members elected as

provided for in California Water District Law, Water Code Section 34000 et. seq.

g) The initial Board of Directors will be elected pursuant to the Water Code sections 34700

et. seq.

h) Pursuant to the applicable Water Code Sections the District is permitted to complete its

duties and responsibilities outlined in the application.

i) The powers of the proposed District will not include the authority to provide sewer service.

The District will set the appropriations limit as soon as feasibly possible consistent with

Government Code Section 57000.

k) The effective formation date of the District will be determined by the filing of the certificate

of completion by the LAFCo Executive Officer with the Kern County Recorder's office

pursuant to the certification of the election results by the Board of Supervisors; and the

Commission authorizes and directs the Executive Officer to file and record any and all

documentation required by law in regards to this proceeding.
